TUITION AND FEES

The most current tuition and fee rates are available on the Student Financial Services website – www.uh.edu/sfs/. Students should be aware that other fees, such as laboratory fees, course fees, parking decals, etc., are not included on the schedule of charges. The University reserves the right to change tuition and other charges without notice as necessitated by university action.

Applications are available each year from November 1 through March 1 for the following academic year. Applications are only available online at www.hrm.uh.edu.

APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID PACKAGES

The University of Houston Office of Scholarship and Financial Aid (OSFA) administers a variety of financial aid programs. Once accepted, you will receive a financial packet that includes a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and a financial aid transcript form. OSFA requires financial transcripts from every college you have attended – even if you did not receive financial aid.

Students must complete a FAFSA every year they apply for financial aid. Results will be mailed to you within four to six weeks of receipt. OSFA determines your financial award by subtracting your expected student contribution from the total cost of attending the Conrad N. Hilton College.

Once your loan is determined, OSFA will assemble a financial aid package that typically will consist of one or more of the following:

- Stafford Student Loan (based on need)
- Unsubsidized Stafford Loan (not based on need)
- Private Loan (based on credit)
- Institutional scholarships
- Grants

With state grants awarded on a first-come first served basis, early submission of financial aid is encouraged. The priority date for submission of all financial aid documents is April 1 for the fall semester.

Entering freshmen, transfer students or presently enrolled students who wish to apply for financial aid must submit a completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by the April 1 priority deadline. This may be obtained from high school counselors or on the web at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Students who receive correspondence from the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid should respond as soon as possible to avoid delays in the processing of their application. In some cases, other forms may be required after initial application forms are submitted, such as financial aid transcripts from previously attended postsecondary institutions, special scholarships or loan supplemental forms. The processing period for aid application is approximately six weeks.
